I love walking with my dog Daisy in our woods in Irma. We have the freedom to roam but we need the boundaries of our property to help us from crossing onto our neighbors' land.

Our online bible study on the book "Good Boundaries & Goodbyes" by Lysa Terkeurst has been so helpful in illustrating that "boundaries are not just a good idea, but they are a God idea." From the beginning of creation in Genesis, God set boundaries to give order to the chaos. Adam and Eve were given so much freedom in the Garden of Eden, but God gave a boundary that limited the

Also to keep a binder of all LRPC meeting minutes and relative information.

Members may serve as liaisons to task forces which offer helpful visioning or assessment of needs

To be a church at the center of town that is a vital, attractive facility, housing a vibrant, caring, and welcoming congregation to which the community looks for sanctuary and spiritual guidance.

TIME COMMITMENT (Length of service):
