DEVOTIONS

Read: Romans 13:1-15.

We are reminded that God has ordered our lives for peace. We may not fully understand God's ways but the message in this scripture gives us a future with hope. That future and that hope identifies God's intentions for us today. In Romans 13:9-10, the commandments are summed up to love your neighbor as yourself. We are reminded that love does no wrong to our neighbor. Out of this love, we have the freedom to speak up and act to defend the rights and needs of others who require support in today's world.

Discuss: How does God's message of a future with hope help us to reach out to people in the world whose freedom is limited?

Pray: O Lord, be with those in our world who cannot see a future with hope. We pray for those who serve communities and nations to keep others free. Amen.
