Pastor's Pondering – February 2022

It's a frigid -19 degrees outside my window as I write this article, and I am thankful for the warmth of our home. I am reminded of how important our family, friends and our faith community are for warming our spirits. That's especially needed when things are difficult or people give us the cold shoulder. We can experience tough times when we are following in the way of Jesus because it is the opposite of the way of worldly power, wealth and fame. Jesus calls us to love people more than things, to serve others rather than demanding to be served and to show strength in suffering rather than power in might.

As a school counselor, I used an analogy of a thermometer and a thermostat for students handling put downs. It can be helpful for us, disciples of Jesus, handling negative influences that impact us too. We don't want to be like thermometers who change with the temperature around them. Right now, there's a lot of blaming, hatred and violence around us, but Jesus tells us that we aren't to act like that. We are more like a thermostat that measures the temperature around it and adjusts to keep things at the right temperature. No matter what the "temperature" of people's words and actions around us, we maintain the love and grace of Christ. When people belittle us or disrespect others, we turn on more of Jesus' love and grace. When people try to give us praise or glory, we can act like a thermometer and downplay our pride to help people praise God and be thankful to Jesus.

Jesus' prayer for the disciples on the night before he died extends to us in our core mission of being in the world but not of the world sharing Christ's truth in love and grace;

¹⁴ I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. ¹⁵ I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. ¹⁷ Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸ As you have sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ And for their sakes I sanctify myself, so that they also may be sanctified in truth" (John 17:14-19).

In this time of cold and stress, turn up His love and grace and live in the truth of Jesus.




