


# **Amazing News! The new Projections Screens Are Here!**

# Pastor's Pondering May 2024

When I was young, I liked to make mobiles. With pictures, sticks or wire and string, it was interesting to see how a movement in one part made every part of the mobile move. A mobile is a helpful illustration of our wellbeing also. The parts of our health are connected and what happens to one part impacts the other areas of our life. We most often think of our physical health, but our mental and spiritual health also impact our quality of life. Each of these areas are important and they need time and attention to maintain wellbeing.

When an accident or an illness happens to our physical body, we know that it deserves attention. Sometimes we can take care of it ourselves but sometimes we need help from those trained in medical care. That is true for our mental and spiritual health as well. When we are faced with stress



or loss, it impacts our mental and spiritual health. We need extra attention and care to respond to the impact on our life. Sometimes we need to seek care from those trained in mental health or those who focus on spiritual wellbeing (like Pastors!) While it may be less obvious than a physical pain, stresses on our mental and spiritual health are just as damaging to our wellbeing if left without care.

It is our goal at Grace to learn more about caring for our mental and spiritual health. Our council and staff are learning more about challenges in our area from professionals trained in mental health. We had a presentation in April from the National Alliance for Mental Illness (NAMI) for our GLOW and Confirmation youth, with a time for parents also. We plan to share more information with our congregation and community by offering workshops to provide information and support such as handling grief, caring for someone with Alzheimer's and other types of stresses in our lives. It is our hope that these caring connections in faith will help bring balance to your life no matter what happens.
