#### Reflecting on My Experience:

Personal Connection: My trip to South Africa was transformative, allowing me to connect deeply with our new friends and church community and witness their rich culture. One of the moments that stood out to me was sharing meals with the families that hosted me. They welcomed me into their homes, and we helped make meals. I felt a genuine warmth and connection from that experience of making food together. Participating in their songs and dances was another highlight; it was exhilarating to join in their dances and learn the words to their music. These experiences opened my eyes to a world that, while different from America, shared the same human spirit.

Family Impact: The trip had a profound effect on my family as well. The shared stories and photos still spark discussions years after our return. It helped my family see the world through a broader lens, inspiring us to embrace different cultures more openly and travel more often. #### Pastor's Pondering-November 2025

Jesus was an awesome teller of stories. The Gospels are full of parables that Jesus used to teach people about God's love and forgiveness. These stories helped people connect and understand about God's kingdom with tangible examples people could relate to.

The disciples each had a story of their life and how Jesus called them to be his follower. That's true for us as well. We each have unique lives and come from different backgrounds to belong to our faith community. It is important for us to share our story and perspective with each other, so we recognize where God is at work in the world.

At our Fall Fill Up, we began by sharing our answers to these 2 questions:

~When did you become a member of Grace?

~What made you want to belong to this faith community?

These two questions help us get to know one another and know more about why people are connected to our faith community. We have lifelong members of Grace baptized and confirmed here but we also have people who developed faith later in their life. Each of us has a unique perspective to share about how our faith developed and how we became part of Grace's family of faith. Would you share your story of faith by answering these two questions? Write your answers on a piece of paper with your name and put it in the box in the Gathering area. Let us know if you would be willing to share your answers to these 2 questions also. This information can help us understand how people came to belong at Grace and why so we can build on God's foundation of faith.

I'll start by sharing my answers to those 2 questions;

~When did you become a member of Grace?

I became a member of Grace when I was called to be Grace's Lead Pastor 4 years ago.

~What made you want to belong to this faith community?

I was raised Catholic but switched to the ELCA because I believe in an open table at communion and women being ordained. I wanted to belong to Grace because we include all people in worship and communion. I also value the way Grace is actively connecting and serving people outside our church building.

#### **Grace Lutheran Church Fall Fill-Up Notes**

October 8, 2025

Approximately 40 people were in attendance. Council President Steve Heikkinen welcomed everyone and led us in prayer. We shared a delicious meal before moving downstairs to the sanctuary.

Following the meal, we gathered in the sanctuary with our bibles. Pastor Julie explained the concept of \*Story Matters: Each congregation has multiple stories. Each community in which we live has multiple stories. Each individual within our communities and congregations has multiple stories. We also have God's story in Scripture. When we are able to take all our various stories and center them in and interpret them through our biblical story, God often enters our lives and the lives of our congregations and communities in most surprising ways.

We were divided into seven groups. Each group had two bible passages to discuss. The questions to contemplate: How is each story like or unlike our congregational story? Does this story identify Grace, challenge Grace, or both? In what ways might this story capture the imagination of the community?

We came back together as one big group. A representative of each group spoke about the bible story that most identified Grace. A few common themes that were expressed include: Grace is welcoming, giving, serving, accepting, trusting.

As a congregation, the challenge is: how we continue to be welcoming, giving, serving? There is always more to do. The next steps: Pastor Julie expressed the desire to get into our bibles more. To help us in our daily lives and grow our faith. Also, in the spring, do a timeline of Grace's development over time and how the church has evolved. Have stories from the congregation-their memories of what they have participated in. Also, to have ongoing conversations about how we share our faith story: ACT group, social media, community forums, newsletter, in the screen before church. Pastor Julie stated that when we share our stories it inspires people to tell their story, and we find insights about what the Bible tells us. Pastor Julie ended the evening with a prayer for the participants.
